問題 #26

For example, if a medical professional not only breached their duty of care but also intentionally hid their mistake from a patient, and the mistake resulted in prolonged suffering for the patient, these factors would be pertinent in deciding to award punitive damages.

Thus, while "breach of duty" is crucial for establishing malpractice, it does not play a direct role in the punitive damages phase of a trial. Instead, punitive damages are more concerned with the severity and nature of the defendant's actions after the initial breach has occurred, particularly focusing on behavior that is willful, malicious, or particularly reckless. This distinction is important in understanding the legal thresholds and considerations in malpractice lawsuits.

問題 #27

問題 #28

Such a narrow focus can lead to a toxic work environment, high turnover rates, and even ethical breaches, all of which are detrimental to the organization's long-term success.

Thus, the correct answer, "decreased emphasis on production efficiency," is not a factor of problematic leadership as per the descriptions by the Institute of Medicine. Instead, it is the increased emphasis on production efficiency that aligns with the concerns raised about leadership issues within organizations.
