The American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders Fifth Edition defines 10 specific personality disorders divided into three clusters: Cluster A, Cluster B, and Cluster C.

Cluster A patients are characterized as withdrawn, cold, suspicious, and irrational. Cluster A includes paranoid, schizoid, and schizotypal personality disorders.

Cluster B patients are characterized as theatrical, emotional, and attention-seeking. They often experience intense interpersonal conflicts and exhibit an extremely labile mood. Cluster B includes antisocial, borderline, histrionic, and narcissistic personality disorders.

* Antisocial personality disorder: These patients exhibit criminal behavior beginning in childhood such as truancy, fighting, destructiveness, and theft. They often default on debts, behave irresponsibly, and act recklessly. They show no remorse for their behavior.

* Borderline personality disorder: These patients exhibit impulsivity, self-harm, inappropriate anger, and affective instability. They feel empty and bored, and they frantically try to avoid abandonment.

* Histrionic personality disorder: These patients appear overly emotional, vague, and desperate for attention, and they demand constant reassurance about their attractiveness.

* Narcissistic personality disorder: These patients act self-important and are preoccupied with envy, fantasies of success, and ruminations about the uniqueness of their problems. They reject criticism and need constant admiration from others.

Cluster C patients tend to be anxious, fearful, tense, and overcontrolled. Cluster C includes avoidant, dependent, and obsessive-compulsive personality disorders.
