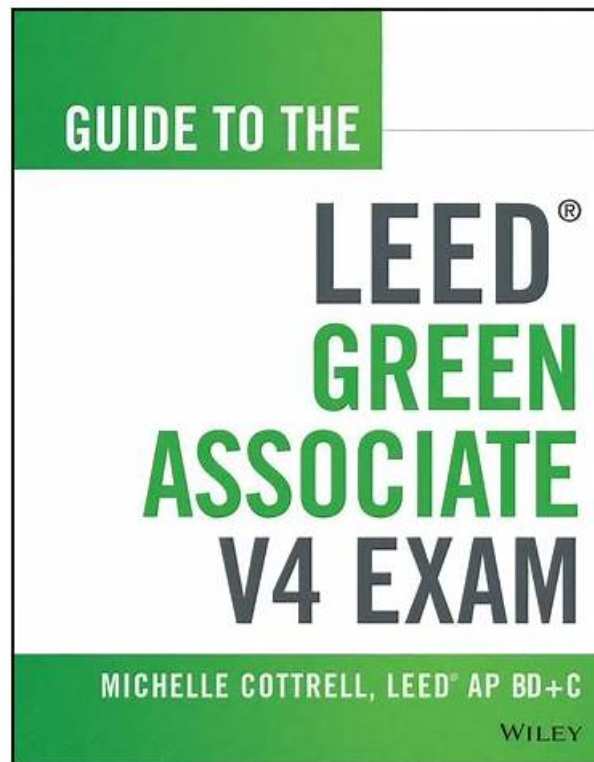

質問 # 291

Which of the following is a design and planning strategy for reducing energy demand?

- A. Extend equipment warranty periods
- B. Maximize thermal bridging
- C. Increase outdoor air ventilation
- D. Size the building appropriately

正解: D

解説:

Sizing the building appropriately means designing the building to meet the needs and expectations of the occupants, without creating excess space that would require more energy to heat, cool, and light. This strategy reduces the energy demand of the building and also saves on construction costs and materials.

質問 # 292

Which of the following benefits pertain to purchasing and installing locally sourced, environmentally preferable products?

- A. The environmental harm associated with transportation is reduced
- B. Products contain recycled content
- C. Products are long lasting and durable
- D. Factories that support human health and workers' rights are used

正解: A

解説:

The environmental harm associated with transportation is reduced when purchasing and installing locally sourced, environmentally preferable products. Locally sourced products are products that are extracted, harvested, recovered, or manufactured within a certain distance from the project site. Environmentally preferable products are products that have reduced environmental impacts compared to similar products in terms of energy use, water use, materials use, waste generation, emissions, toxicity, and durability. Purchasing and installing locally sourced, environmentally preferable products reduces the amount of fuel consumption, greenhouse gas emissions, air pollution, and road congestion associated with transporting products over long distances. The LEED Green Associate Candidate Handbook states that one of the strategies for achieving materials and resources efficiency is to "use local or regional materials (extracted, processed and manufactured within 100 miles)" [1, p. 15]. 質問 # 293

What is the percentage rule when making a decision on the rating system that is most appropriate to use for a project?

- A. 40/60 rule
- B. 30/70 rule
- C. 60/40 rule
- D. 50/50 rule

正解: A

解説:

The percentage rule is a method to determine the most appropriate LEED rating system for a project when several rating systems may be applicable¹. To use this rule, first assign a rating system to each square foot or square meter of the building, and then choose the most appropriate rating system based on the resulting percentages¹. The entire gross floor area of a LEED project must be certified under a single rating system and is subject to all prerequisites and attempted credits in that rating system¹. The percentage rule states that if one rating system covers more than 60% of the gross floor area, that rating system should be used¹. If no rating system covers more than 60% of the gross floor area, but one covers more than 40%, then that rating system should be used¹. If no rating system covers more than 40% of the gross floor area, then the project team can choose any applicable rating system¹.

Therefore, the answer is B. 40/60 rule.

質問 # 294

The general contractor for a project located in a dense urban area attempts to gain a credit in Materials and Resources. Which of the following is considered a local material?

- A. Bamboo flooring that is harvested 2.350 mi. (3 782 km) away and manufactured 200 mi. (322 km) away from the project site
- B. Quarry tile that is extracted 370 mi (595 km) away and manufactured in a city 1.600 mi (2 575 km) away
- C. Stone that is harvested and processed 80 mi (128.7 km) from the project site and purchased 75 mi. (121 km) away
- D. Vinyl flooring manufactured 500 mi (805 km) away but is sold at a warehouse 2 mi (3.2 km) from the project site

正解: C

解説:

Explanation

Stone that is harvested and processed 80 mi (128.7 km) from the project site and purchased 75 mi (121 km) away is considered a local material because it meets the criteria of being extracted, harvested, recovered, or manufactured within 100 mi (160 km) of the project site. Local materials can help reduce environmental impacts associated with transportation, such as greenhouse gas emissions, air pollution, and energy consumption. Local materials can also support the local economy and community. LEED projects can earn credits for using local materials under the Materials and Resources category.
