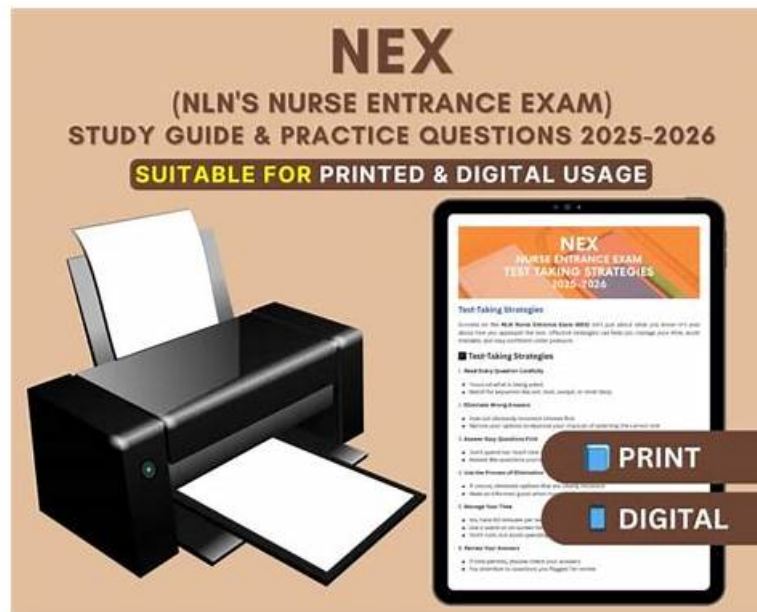

$120,000 = 111,600$. Therefore, approximately 111,600 children would have normal cholesterol levels, making option D correct.

Option A incorrectly calculates 7% instead of the complement. Option C represents 70%, not 93%. Option B is close but incorrect due to rounding. NEX math questions often assess whether students understand that "normal" refers to the remainder after subtracting the affected group.
