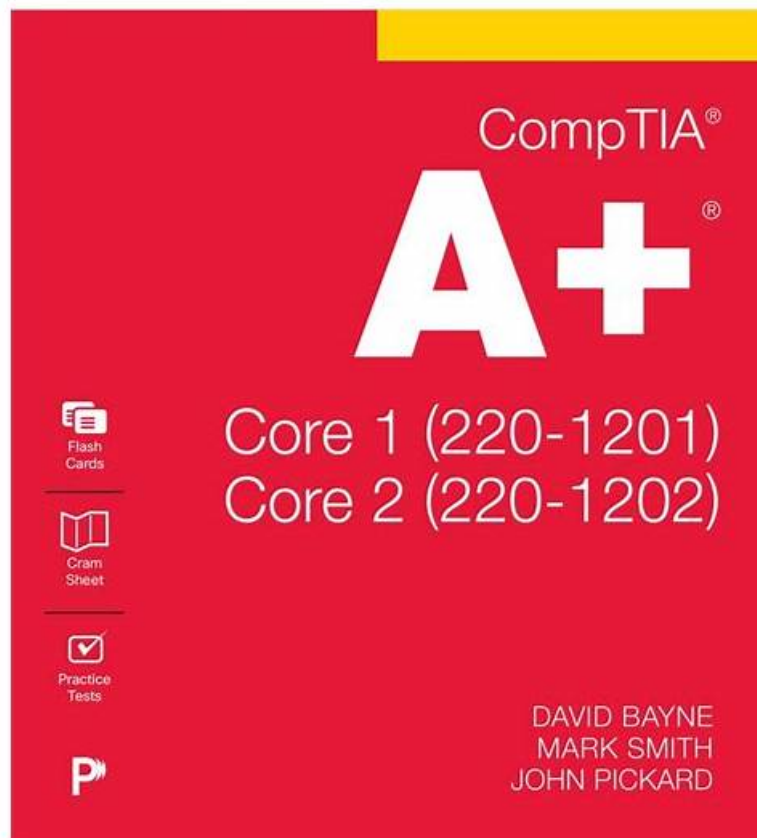

Therefore, D and F are the correct answers.
