In answer A the female patient may have a life-threatening condition; however, administering oxygen via a nasal cannula and/or transfusing blood does not qualify as critical care. Management of a patient who receives chronic ventilator therapy is also not considered critical care because the medical decision-making involved in the therapy is quite low. The care a patient receives after having surgery would be considered routine and postoperative, regardless of where they are sent, unless a complication arises in which one or more of the vital organ systems begins to deteriorate in a fashion that poses a threat to life.
