

It also includes managing licensing, alert systems, dashboards, metrics, cost assessments, capacity optimization, workload planning, and system monitoring. Additionally, it explores access control, patching, and retention settings in vRealize Log Insight, ensuring ongoing operational excellence across VMware tools.

Candidates also explore deployment tools such as Remote Collectors and Cloud Proxies to understand their role in scalable cloud operations.
