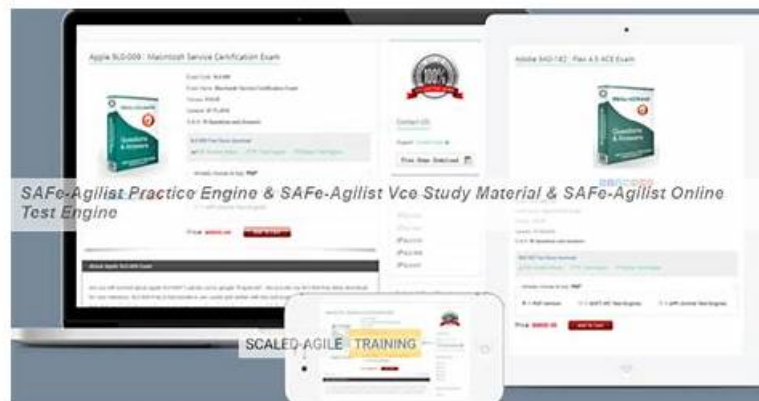

Committed objectives are SMART goals that reflect the value that each team intends to deliver in a PI with high confidence.

Uncommitted objectives are stretch goals that reflect additional value that each team may be able to deliver in a PI if they have extra

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
