By explicitly stating the value, the team can " Analyze to Determine What is Valuable " and prioritize the backlog effectively. This focus prevents the team from building features just for the sake of functionality. Instead, it ensures every piece of code written is directly tied to a specific persona ' s needs and provides a clear benefit to the organization, which is central to the " Think as a Customer " principle.

This practice is a key application of the " Avoid Waste " principle at the Initiative Horizon . Agile analysis emphasizes delivering the minimum amount of output required to achieve a specific outcome. By stopping to evaluate whether the business need has already been satisfied after each increment, the team can identify the point of diminishing returns. If the goal has been achieved, the remaining work in the backlog can be cancelled or de-prioritized, allowing resources to be redeployed to other high-value initiatives. This continuous assessment ensures that the organization remains efficient and focused on outcomes rather than simply checking off list items.
