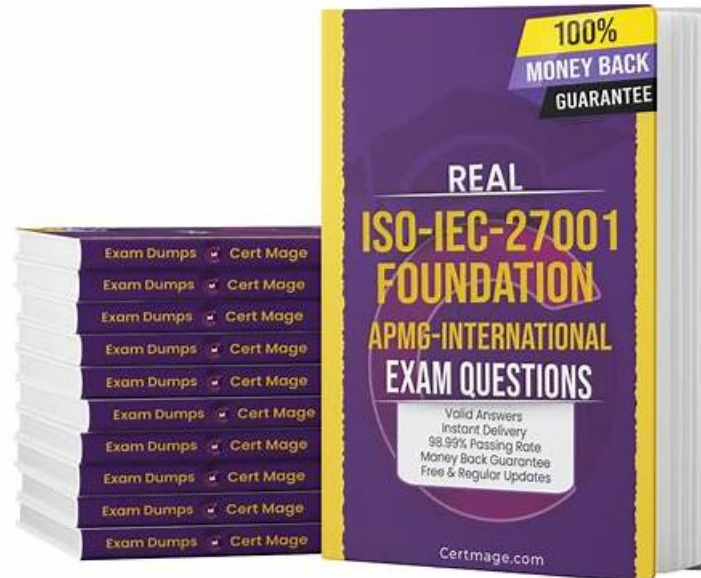

Topic 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Information Management (IM): Information management (IM) encompasses the entire lifecycle of information within an organization—from its collection and storage to its distribution, use, and eventual archiving or disposal.</li> </ul>

Clause 10.2 (Continual Improvement) specifies that the organization must "continually improve the suitability, adequacy and effectiveness of the information security management system." This makes it clear that three attributes are explicitly required to be addressed:

- \* Suitability: ensuring the ISMS continues to meet organizational needs in changing contexts.
- \* Adequacy: ensuring the ISMS covers the necessary scope and provides sufficient control coverage.
- \* Effectiveness: ensuring the ISMS achieves intended outcomes in protecting information security.

The word "importance" is not part of the continual improvement requirement. Importance is implicit in prioritization of risks and actions, but it is not a required continual improvement attribute in ISO/IEC 27001.

Therefore, option D: Importance is the correct choice as it is not specified.

This distinction reinforces that continual improvement is not about subjective importance, but about systematic enhancement of the ISMS's suitability, adequacy, and effectiveness.

ISO/IEC 27001 Clause 4.3 requires: "The scope shall be available as documented information." Certification Bodies require this scope statement to plan audit duration, resources, and coverage. Only after the scope is agreed does the Stage 1 audit begin, which reviews documented information and readiness. Stage 2 focuses on implementation and effectiveness. Evidence of corrective actions (C) is checked at Stage 2 if issues were identified earlier. Records provision (D) occurs during Stage 2, not first. Thus, the first step in preparing for certification is A: Agreeing the scope of the ISMS with the Certification Body auditor.

This means the communication obligation is not limited to top management (A) or only ISMS staff (B), nor does it stop at employees only (C). Instead, ISO/IEC 27001/27002 mandate a broader scope: all relevant personnel and relevant interested parties must be informed. This ensures both internal stakeholders (employees, contractors, temporary staff) and external interested parties (suppliers, partners, regulators, customers, etc.) receive the right policy communications where applicable. Therefore, the correct and verified answer is D.
