Within this focus area, the candidates need to prove their competency in self-organizing teams, facilitation, leadership styles, coaching & mentoring. This domain contains practical approaches to personal self-development that equip an individual with the knowledge and skills needed to increase team collaboration.

Therefore, if the CEO wants to add a "very important" item to a Sprint that is in progress, he or she should communicate with the Product Owner, who can then decide whether to cancel or continue the current Sprint.
