Therefore, the injection that must be refrigerated is Enbrel.

#Incorrect - "p.c." means after meals, not without meals.

* (C) Take one tablet by mouth four times daily before meals and at bedtime.#Incorrect - "p.c." means after meals, not before.

* (D) Take one tablet by mouth four times daily after meals and at bedtime.#Correct - Matches the SIG interpretation.
