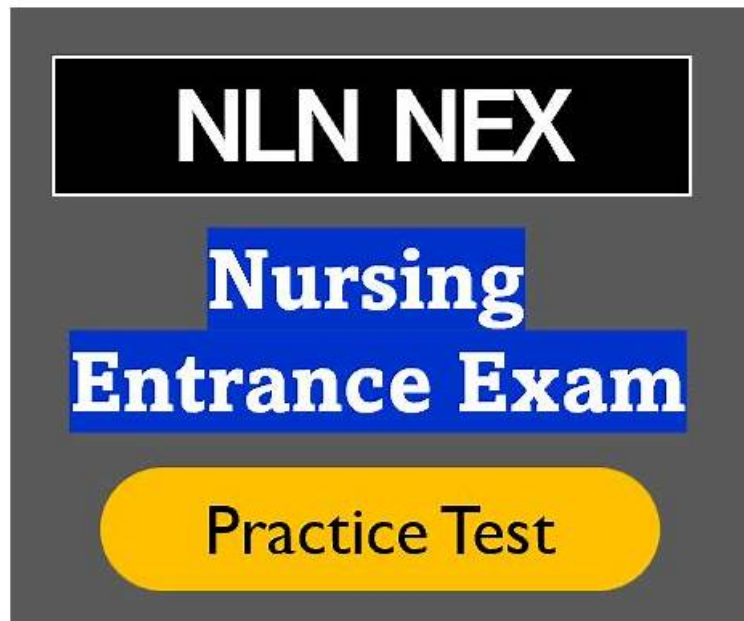


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## NLN Nursing Entrance Exam (Math, Science and Verbal) Sample Questions (Q54-Q59):

### NEW QUESTION # 54

The diagram below shows the rough endoplasmic reticulum of a cell as seen under the electron microscope.

The structures labeled Z are the site of protein synthesis.

Z is indicating

- A. mitochondria.
- B. centrosomes.
- C. ribosomes.
- D. chromosomes.

**Answer: C**

Explanation:

This question focuses on cell structure and function. The rough endoplasmic reticulum (RER) is characterized by the presence of small, dark granules attached to its surface. These granules are ribosomes. Ribosomes are the cellular structures responsible for protein synthesis, as they translate messenger RNA into amino acid chains. The presence of ribosomes gives the rough endoplasmic reticulum its "rough" appearance under an electron microscope. Mitochondria are involved in energy production, centrosomes play a role in cell division, and chromosomes contain genetic material within the nucleus. None of these structures are responsible for protein synthesis on the surface of the RER. The NEX Science exam frequently includes diagrams requiring students to identify organelles and link them to their functions. Recognizing ribosomes as the site of protein synthesis is a fundamental concept in cell biology.

Reading Comprehension

Passage:

Vaccinations work by stimulating the immune system to recognize and fight specific pathogens. Once vaccinated, the body can respond more quickly if exposed to the disease in the future, often preventing illness entirely.

Which statement best explains how vaccines protect the body?

Option B is the opposite of what the passage states, as vaccines strengthen immune response.

Option D is incorrect because vaccines are preventive, not treatments administered after symptoms appear.

During prolonged, strenuous physical activity, muscle cells undergo a type of anaerobic respiration that produces

**Answer: B**

Explanation:

When oxygen levels are insufficient during intense exercise, muscle cells switch from aerobic respiration to anaerobic respiration. In this process, pyruvic acid is converted into lactic acid. The NEX Science exam frequently tests metabolic pathways related to exercise and energy production, making lactic acid the correct answer.

Review the image of the human digestive tract shown below.

□ What is the principal process occurring in the region labeled 4?

- A. Hydrolysis of proteins
- B. Assimilation of fatty acids
- C. Absorption of water
- D. Synthesis of triglycerides

**Answer: C**

Explanation:

Region 4 in the diagram corresponds to the large intestine. The primary function of the large intestine is the absorption of water and electrolytes from undigested food material. This process helps concentrate waste material into feces before elimination. Assimilation of fatty acids and synthesis of triglycerides occur primarily in the small intestine, especially within intestinal epithelial cells. Hydrolysis of proteins occurs mainly in the stomach and small intestine through the action of enzymes such as pepsin and proteases. The NEX Science exam often tests digestive system function by matching specific organs to their primary processes. Since water absorption is the defining function of the large intestine, option B is correct.

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### NEW QUESTION # 58

Twenty daily systolic blood pressure measurements are shown in the graph. The red line indicates when a patient stopped taking their blood pressure medication.

Estimate the patient's average increase in blood pressure from the first set of 10 measurements to the second set of 10 measurements.

- A. 160 points
- B. 30 points
- C. 155 points
- D. 50 points

**Answer: B**

Explanation:

This problem tests estimation and interpretation of scatter plots. The first 10 measurements (before the red line) cluster around an average of approximately 140 mmHg. The second set of 10 measurements (after the red line) cluster around approximately 170 mmHg. To estimate the increase, subtract the earlier average from the later average:  $170 - 140 = 30$  points. Therefore, option C is correct. Options A and D represent total values rather than the change between averages. Option B overestimates the difference. On the NEX, estimation questions do not require exact calculations; instead, you must identify reasonable average values from visual data and compare them correctly.
