The other options do not directly solve this requirement. Information Barriers are designed for communication and collaboration segmentation scenarios, not for ordinary site-level oversharing remediation.

A Defender data connector is unrelated to SharePoint permission enforcement. Conditional Access controls sign-in and session access conditions, but it does not selectively remove Copilot grounding from one SharePoint site for users who still have site permissions. Because Copilot uses SharePoint and Microsoft Graph permissions as its boundary, the Microsoft-documented corrective action is to fix the Finance site permissions .

The correct answer is a site member of . In the exhibit, the Site members group for Site1 contains Everyone except external users with Edit permissions. Microsoft documents that "Everyone except external users" automatically includes all internal users and excludes external guests . Since User1 is a newly created user in the organization, User1 is an internal user and is therefore included in that built-in principal.

Because that built-in principal is placed in the Site members group, User1 inherits member-level access to the site. User1 is not a site owner, because the Site owners group contains only the Global Administrator entry shown in the exhibit. User1 is also not merely a visitor, because the Site visitors group is listed as None

. Finally, User1 is not prevented from accessing the site, because the membership granted through Everyone except external users gives internal users access to the site according to the permissions assigned to that group.

For identifying externally shared SharePoint sites and Teams- connected sites, Microsoft's documented reporting path is the SharePoint admin center .
