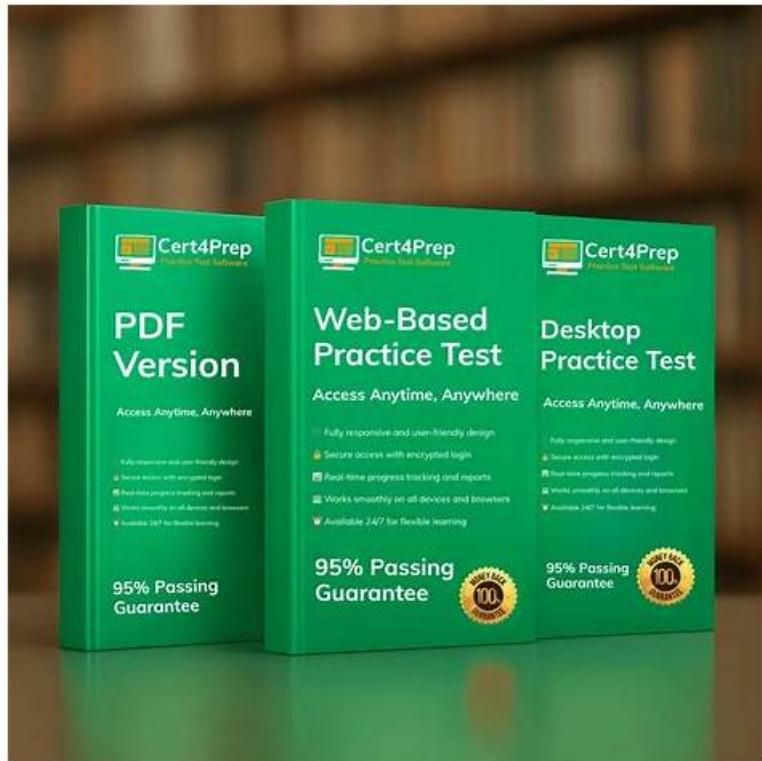

Elicitation is not just "collecting" requirements; it also includes dealing with conflicts that emerge when different stakeholders express incompatible needs, expectations or priorities. Conflict analysis, negotiation and resolution are therefore components of elicitation activities.

Validation focuses on checking correctness and quality of documented requirements, while management handles versioning, traceability and change control. Documentation is about representing requirements in suitable forms. Thus, conflict resolution is explicitly placed under elicitation.

Life cycle management defines allowed states (draft, approved, implemented, retired, etc.) and the transitions between them for requirements and other RE work products, fulfilling A and B. It applies not only to single requirements but also to documents or baselines, so C is correct. However, quality control-checking adequacy, completeness or consistency-is performed by validation, reviews and quality assurance activities, not by life cycle management itself. State transitions may be conditional on quality checks, but life cycle management does not "control the quality" per se. Therefore D is the wrong statement.
